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REPORT ON COMPLIANCE WITH STATE LAWS AND REGULATIONS

We have compiled the accompanying Statement of Cash Receipts and Disbursements – Governmental and Business-type Activities, Schedule of Investments, Schedule of Capital Assets, Schedule of Long-Term Debt and Schedule of Surety Bonds for Municipal Officials of the Town of West, Mississippi, for the year ended September 30, 2020, in accordance with Statements of Standards for Accounting and Review Services issued by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. The financial statement has been prepared on the cash basis of accounting, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles in the United States of America.

We have performed procedures to test compliance with certain state laws and regulations as described in the Municipal Compliance Questionnaire that is prescribed by the Office of the State Auditor. Our procedures were substantially less in scope than an audit, the objective of which is the expression of an opinion on the town's compliance with these requirements. Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion.

The results of those procedures disclosed an instance of noncompliance with state laws and regulations. Our findings and recommendations and your response are as follows:

1. Fines and forfeitures

<u>Finding</u>

Sections 99-19-73 & 83-39-3, Miss Code Ann. (1972) requires local governments to deposit fines and forfeitures monthly with the Department of Finance and Administration

Recommendation

We recommend the Town comply with Sections 99-19-73 & 83-39-3, Miss Code Ann. (1972) and settle monthly with the Department of Finance and Administration. <u>Response</u>

We will comply with Sections 99-19-73 & 83-39-3, Miss Code Ann. (1972) and settle monthly with the Department of Finance and Administration

We have applied certain agreed-upon procedures, as discussed below, to the accounting records of the Town of West, Mississippi, as of September 30, 2020, and for the year then ended, as required by the Office of the State Auditor, under the provisions of Section 21-35-31, Miss. Our procedures and findings are as follows:

1) We reconciled cash on deposit with the following banks to balances in the respective general ledger accounts and obtained confirmation of the related balances from the banks:

- 2) We performed the following procedures with respect to taxes on real and personal property (including motor vehicles) levied during the fiscal year:
 - a. Trace levies to governing body minutes;
 - b. Traced distribution of taxes collected to proper funds; and
 - c. Analyzed increase in taxes for most recent period for compliance with increase limitations of Sections 27-39-320 to 27-39-323, Miss. Code Ann. (1972).

The distribution of taxes to funds was found to be in accordance with prescribed tax levies.

Ad valorem tax collections were found to be within the limitations of §27-39-320 to §27-39-323, Miss. Code Ann. (1972).

There were no ad valorem tax collections for the retirement of General Obligation Debt.

3) We obtained a statement of payments made by the Department of Finance and Administration to the municipality. Payments indicated were traced to deposit in the respective bank accounts and recorded in the general ledger without exception. Payments traced were as follows:

4) We selected a sample of purchases made by the municipality during the fiscal year. Each sample item was evaluated for compliance with purchasing requirements set forth in Title 31, Chapter 7, Miss. Code Ann. (1972), as applicable.

The sample consisted of the following:

- b. Total Dollar Value of Sample \$7,664

We found the municipality's purchasing procedures to be in agreement with the requirements of the above-mentioned sections.

- 5) We prepared a list of fines and forfeitures to verify state-imposed court assessments collected. We found the municipal clerk has settled quarterly with the Department of Finance and Administration. The Town should settle state-imposed assessments monthly to be in compliance with the Department of Finance and Administration Sections 99-19-73 & 83-39-3.
- 6) We have read the Municipal Compliance Questionnaire completed by the municipality. The completed survey indicated no instances of noncompliance with state requirements.

Because the above procedures do not constitute an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we do not express an opinion on any of the specific accounts or classes of transactions referred to above. In connection with the procedures referred to above, no matters came to our attention that caused us to believe the items specified in paragraphs 1, 2, and 3 should be adjusted. Had we performed additional procedures or had we conducted an audit of the financial statements in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, matters might have come to our attention that would have been reported to you. This report should not be associated with the financial statements of the Town of West, Mississippi for the year ended September 30, 2020.
